Attach a signed statement, self-certifying that you meet the definition of dislocated worker: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - You have been laid off, OR - You received a notice of termination or layoff, OR - You were self-employed and are now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster. 2. Verify your status by submitting your notice of termination or layoff, first unemployment insurance letter/statement (indicating dislocation employer), notice of eligibility and benefits from public assistance agency, or quarterly estimated tax for self-employed persons (IRS Schedule C).

Attach a signed statement, self-certifying that you meet the definition of displaced homemaker: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - You have been providing unpaid services to a family member in the home, AND - You are dependent on the income of another family member, but are no longer supported by that income, AND - You are currently unemployed or underemployed. 2. Verify your dependence on the income of another family member. You can use tax documentation that list your occupation and that of the other family member, showing that the bulk of income was earned by the other family member. 3. Verify your change in living arrangements by submitting court documents, divorce decree, separation agreement, attorney's statements, etc., or a document from another person who can certify your change of living arrangements.
